Through interviews, testing and skills review, each client will be assessed as to his/her abilities and introduced to a compatible workplace or training site for employment or further skills development, with full time employment the planned result. If the proposed client is accepted, a full plan review will be forwarded to his/her parole officer; support worker or CFS worker.

All clients will have resume and skills information updated as needed. Assistance with proper office and workplace etiquette and dress will be provided. Weekly gatherings of the clients and their families will be encouraged, through pot-luck dinners with drumming and singing as well as family 'learn to dance' evenings. Volunteer projects within the community will be posted and strongly suggested that clients to become involved. All events will be drug, alcohol and substance free. Anyone found to be using any mind-altering substance will be immediately removed from the program.

House Rules

- 1. No mind-altering substances are to be used by any client or member of a client's family using the services of **Society 2000**, **Inc.** Unless under direct doctors supervision with proof of prescription provided.
- 2. No violence, threats of violence, intimidation or acts of violence will be tolerated.
- 3. All communication for the purposes of assisting a client will be held in strict confidence. Information that is relevant to the security of **Society 2000, Inc.** personnel and clients will be passed on to the appropriate agency. Requests for client information from other agencies must be in writing, with release of information permission signed by the client.
- 4. No personal relationships between **Society 2000, Inc.** personnel and clients will be tolerated.

Society 2000, Inc. is a vision for tomorrow. By providing an alternative approach to information, Society 2000, Inc., will give a friendly face to the new community member. Through community partnerships and networking connections, Society 2000, Inc., will remove many of the barriers to employment, training and social programs.
